The members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and our neighbors in need thank you for your

contributions even during the uncertainties past year. We made 222 visits assisting families, including 100 adults and 66 children in 2020. Many are singleparent families or present some disability, and others suffer from hopelessness.

The 2020 initial balance was \$3,773. We received a total of \$33,066 in donations and special collections, spending \$31,874 in charitable works. 3rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



This Sunday is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our Church's Liturgical calendar, the Ordinary Time begins with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (1st Sunday in Ordinary Time), which occurs on

the Sunday after the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, officially ending the Christmas Season. The Ordinary Time continues until Ash Wednesday, which is the beginning of the Season of Lent. It resumes on the Monday after the Solemnity of Pentecost. On the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe". The Ordinary Time usually runs for 33 or 34 weeks in total.

Green is the liturgical colour of Ordinary Time, symbolizing "life" and "hope". Therefore, Ordinary Time is a time of growth and maturation. It is a time that we grow in the Holy Spirit, allowing the mystery of God to penetrate deeper into our hearts and lives.

The word "ordinary" usually means something plain, unimpressive, unexciting, or even boring. However, this word comes from the Latin word 'ordinalis' which means "numbered" or "ruled". So, the season of Ordinary Time is not a time of uneventful boredom, but it's about having rhythm, rule of life, consistency, discipline, etc. It is time that we perfect ourselves through the practice of virtues. Just like athletes need to train consistently and repetitively with a schedule to prepare for a competition, we too need the same type of consistent spiritual training and schedule to prepare ourselves for heaven. It is time to build good habits to replace bad habits. Like the expression, "Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary", it is a time of extraordinary growth and commitment.
