REFLECTION BY FR. RAYMOND SO It's Worth the Wait for Christmas!

castle, which I am sure kids and parents alike got a kick out of while trick-or-treating. As November came around, that was taken down to be immediately replaced by two jovial inflatables. My favourite is the helicopter flown by penguins, complete with spinning rotors.

For many of us, such as this neighbour of ours, Christmas cannot arrive quickly enough. After almost two years of lockdowns and restrictions, we are heading to a better place with new opportunities to gather and celebrate with families and friends. Yet the Church challenges us by asking us to enter into the season of Advent first, whose central theme is to wait.

Yes, Christmas will come on December 25, but first we have to pass through four weeks of rather subdued tones, when even the Glory to God is dropped from our liturgical celebrations.

What does waiting teach us? We learn that in our relationship with God, we are not the ones to dictate the terms or the time. We do not tell God how he should answer our prayers. Like Mary and Joseph, we head into the unknown, whether it be about the worldwide pandemic, our local communities, or our own personal lives.

We all have plans and aspirations, but all it takes is a census or a pandemic to derail everything. Yet the true joy of Christmas is not about having the perfect party or getting the best presents. It is about the coming of our Lord Jesus into our midst, often at the most unexpected moments and places, as he did two thousand years ago in a manger at Bethlehem. He is always worth waiting for.
