On Thursday, September 30, 2021, across the country, Canadians will be observing the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The ongoing journey to healing and reconciliation has a particular relevance for Catholics throughout Canada given the church's

involvement in operating many residential schools and recognizing the suffering and intergenerational trauma that remains for many survivors to this day. This day provides an opportunity for all Canadians to recognize and commemorate the legacy of residential schools, and commit to working for truth and reconciliation in the relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada.

WHAT IS LIFE CHAIN?

Life Chain is a peaceful and silent witness to the injustice of abortion and the harm it inflicts on mothers, fathers, and the community at large. It is a simple but powerful reminder to our fellow citizens of the sanctity of human life and our duty to defend the weakest members of our society.

The very first Life Chain was held in 1987 by a small pro-life group called Please Let Me Live Inc. in Yuba City, California and consisted of 2,500 people. The annual event grew by leaps and bounds in the following years, with Canada holding its first Life Chain in 1990, and almost 1,000,000 participating across North America in 1992. In 2019, there were over 250 Life Chains in Canada and over 15,000 are estimated to have participated from coast to coast.





As usual, this year, Life Chain will be held on the first Sunday of October - October 3, 2021. Please determine the location and time of your nearest Life Chain by visiting: www.campaignlifecoalition.com/life-chain.

On the day of the event, those participating in Life Chain will stand at various predetermined intersections in silent prayer, holding non-graphic signs with slogans like, "Abortion kills children," "Abortion hurts women," "Adoption, the loving option," and "Life, the first inalienable right." The signs are distributed and collected by a local organizer at each intersection. This organizer will orient and space out Life Chain participants, and will talk to law enforcement and any media that may wish to cover the event.

Life Chain organizers and participants are asked to follow all local COVID-19 protocols. This is a relatively low-risk event that was carried out safely in 2020, and thus, the ongoing pandemic ought not impede our efforts to publicly share our reverence for life with others.
