In order to love others with God's love, we must first be filled with that same love through our practice of prayer. # <u>The year in review - 2021</u>

We all have experienced a full year of precautions and restrictions due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The Neighbours in Need within our community have survived, considering the challenges of workplace shut downs, limited social services and on-line schooling. The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul continues to assist our neighbours in need in the parish community from the donations we received at the church.

The St. Justin Martyr Conference regularly provides food voucher assistance to over 30 families, including 38 children and 77 adults, in our community, for a total of 210 home visits. These families, without your donations, would likely struggle to put food on their tables. Your generous donations to the Society bring them hope for a better future for their families.

Bundle up weekends, where we collect gently used clothing, are a popular and successful activity at our parish. We conducted two bundle up collections, when we filled the container both times.

We also provided beds and other furniture for our Neighbours in Need. When we receive special requests from our families, we placed requests in the bulletin and were always able to provide.

Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, in August, we were able to distribute Walmart gift cards to families with children to assist in purchasing school supplies.

In October, with the help of The Knights of Columbus, we collected winter coats that were distributed to our Neighbours in Need, before the cold weather arrived.

In December, with the help of the Caring and Sharing Program, we were able to distribute No Frills and Walmart gift cards to families for Christmas, so they could experience the joy of the season.

We continue to contribute funding to St. Lucy's Conference, our twinning conference in St Lucia. They continue to struggle with COVID 19 restrictions and are very grateful for our assistance.

Outside of the work we do in our conference, we also support Society of Saint Vincent de Paul programs in Toronto: Emergency Shelters for Women in Crisis, Supportive Housing, Stores Division and Court Services.

Our mission is to serve Christ through our Neighbours in Need with love, respect, justice, and joy. At the heart of our work are home visits, facilitated by committed volunteers from our parish, to provide support and friendship.

Please continue to pray for our volunteers and the Neighbours in Need.
