In today's second reading (1 Cor. 12.12-30), St. Paul teaches us a great lesson that can enrich our lives of stewardship. He says, "Just as

the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." We are made up of many different body parts that each have their own important and distinct role to play in order for the entire body to live. It is the same way in the Church.

If we tried to change ourselves to become like someone else, we would be robbing the Church of our own unique contributions. St. Therese uses a beautiful image of a garden to express the importance of embracing who God made us to be. The year in review - 2024

Despite the challenges we are all experiencing these days, the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul continues to assist our neighbours in need in the parish community from the donations we received from our generous donors at St. Justin Martyr Parish.

The St. Justin Martyr Conference regularly provides food voucher assistance to over 35 families, including 35 children and 88 adults, in our community, for a total of 245 home visits. These families, without your donations, would likely struggle to put food on their tables and provide for their children. Your generous donations to the Society bring them hope for a better future for their families.

Twice a year, we conduct bundle up weekends, where we collect gently used clothing, and these events are a popular and successful activity at our parish. We were able to fill the container both times.

We have been able to provide baby supplies, kids clothing, laptops and some furniture to our Neighbours in Need. When we received special requests from our families, we placed these requests in the bulletin and thanks to generous donors, we were able to provide.

In August, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, we were able to distribute Walmart gift cards to families with children to assist in purchasing school supplies.

In October, three of our local schools collected winter coats that were distributed to Neighbours in Need in our community, before the cold weather arrived.

In December, with the help of the Caring and Sharing Program, we were able to distribute No Frills and Walmart gift cards to the families for Christmas, so they could experience the joy of the season.

We continue to contribute funding to St. Lucy's Conference, our twinning conference in St. Lucia, and St. Philip Neri Conference, in Toronto. They are very grateful for our consistent annual assistance.

Outside of the work we do in our conference, we have been able to pass up money to Greater Toronto Central Council to support Society of Saint Vincent de Paul programs in Toronto: Emergency Shelters for Women in Crisis, Recovery Housing, Supportive Housing, Stores Division and Court Services.


