Hello sisters of the League, 2024 passed by so quickly. As we close the year, let us look back to what we, together, have accomplished for the year.

Our council is so blessed with having so many talented members who, with the guidance from our Lady of Good Counsel, have continuously strived to be better in their service to the Lord.

Our sisters are actively involved in the various ministries in the parish such as the layperson ministry, lectors, RCIA, RCIC, Music Ministry, Food Drive, Refugee coordinator.

The Catholic Women's League (CWL) is a national organization, which calls its members to grow in faith, Social Justice, and to witness to the love of God through ministry and service. Our members come from many backgrounds and cultures. The diverse landscape has brought us closer as we pool our talents and charm to bring about the many programs and activities in 2024.

The year began with our members attending the Value-based Time Management online seminar presented by Ontario Provincial Council and the Toronto Diocesan Council (TDC) President and Vice President Workshop presented by TDC Past President Sue Lubowitz. Nine members and Monsignor Vid, our Spiritual Advisor, attended The Prayer for Christian Unity mass at St. Mark's Orthodox church.

In February, we held the Valentine's Raffle which featured thirteen wonderful prizes. The annual

Pancake Breakfast Sunday in partnership with the Knights of Columbus took place, where parishioners enjoyed hot pancakes, sausages and drinks while mingling with fellow parishioners. March was a busy month. Our council donated seven boxes of diapers for the annual Baby Month. We had two weekends of Easter fundraising selling plant arrangements and chocolates where we raised \$1290.10 for ShareLife. A cheque for ShareLife was presented to Monsignor Vid at the March Council meeting. Monsignor Vid celebrated his 74th birthday on March 12th in the presence of many members of the parish ministries. Several CWL members also attended the 34th Annual Ordinandi Dinner held on March 19th and the 14th Annual Dynamic Women of Faith Conference on March 23rd. At the Easter Vigil, many of our CWL sisters, who were the sponsors, witnessed the baptism of their Catechumens in a very solemn and lovely ceremony.



The month of April saw our executive team planning and getting things ready for the bi-annual Friendship Tea. Our members were busy selling tickets and fascinators for two weekends after every mass. One of our members, a lay apostolate lead, organized two dinners for the St. Augustine's seminarians and priests. On April 28th, two of our past presidents attended Blessed Trinity Council's High Tea. The 103rd Annual TDC Convention was held at Ajax Convention Center on April 29th & 30th. Many members attended the two-day session and the dinner. Our council was presented with an Increase in Membership Certificate of Recognition. The event provided lots of learnings to take away. Past President Diane Olmstead was honoured to be appointed North York Regional Chair by incoming Toronto Diocesan Council President Kate O'Quinn.



The month of May started with our council joining the Legion of Mary in celebration of the "Crowning of Mary" and participated in praying a decade of the rosary. On May 5th, we held the much-anticipated Friendship Tea with the theme "Celebrate Mothers". The parish hall was elegantly decorated in pink and white motifs with homemade sandwiches and baked goods specially prepared by our members. Our speaker was Ms. Ruth Ann Onley, spouse of the late Honourable David Onley, 28th Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Ontario, contributing author of the book "Faith, Life and Leadership: Vol 2, a mother, and a grandmother of nine. Everyone was captivated by Ms. Onley's powerful rendition of faith-based songs as she narrated her personal life experience and faith journey. Twenty-five anniversary pins were presented to our members for their services to the council. The event was very well attended with more than 130 guests. On May 11th, some members attended the ordination for Fr. Marko, and Fr. Ryan (currently Associate Pastor at St. Justin Martyr Parish). On May 12th, Fr. On September 8, Diane, Ricky, and I attended the TDC 40th annual Rosary Sunday at the Martyr's Shrine in Midland Ontario. The event was very solemn and attended by many CWL members, and other visitors. We held our first council meeting on September 17 and commemorated National Day for Truth and Reconciliation by wearing orange shirts to the meeting.
